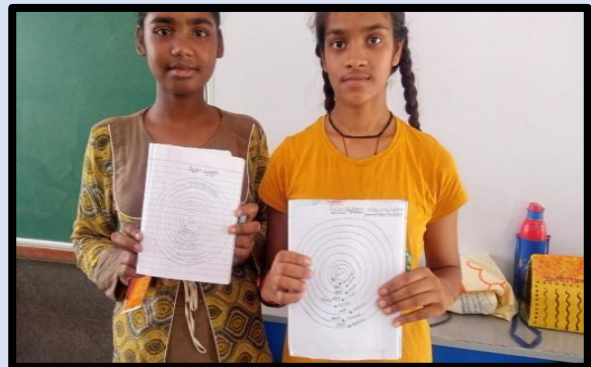
The children of the Vivekananda Paathshala were overwhelmed to be back for the offline sessions and we at JKPS are glad to continue to provide education and recreational support to the children.
