






























School Tour

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






















































































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






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












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Junk box activity




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Earth Day Celebration - Recite a Poem

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




















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Happy Earth vs. Sad Earth Sorting Activity


Mirror Activity

Through this engaging experience, students strengthened their focus and enjoyed the spirit of movement and collaboration.

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








































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





























Vowel Crossword Puzzle

This playful and engaging exercise not only boosted language development but also encouraged critical thinking and attention to detail, making learning a joyful experience.

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









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APRIL ACTIVITY REPORT

ACTIVITIES





Hindi activity

An engaging and educational Organ Apron Activity was conducted for Class 3 on 15th April as part of the EVS curriculum. The objective of the activity was to help students understand the functions



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


