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CUET 2025 Workshop: Empowering Educators to Guide the Way Forward

On Saturday, April 26th, 2025, a crucial CUET 2025 workshop was organized for the teachers of Classes X to XII at Jaspal Kaur Public School, led by the School Counsellor, Ms. Vanshika Sharma, to disseminate key updates about the Common University Entrance Test 2025. Drawing on insights from the recent CBSE orientation programme for Principals and Counsellors—attended by the school's Principal and Counsellor the workshop aimed to equip educators with a thorough understanding of the CUET 2025 framework to effectively guide their students. A significant portion of the session was dedicated to elucidating the notable changes from the 2024 edition, including a reduction in the number of subjects from six to five, the transition from a hybrid format to a fully online Computer-Based Test (CBT), and revised subject selection criteria that now permit candidates to choose from a broader range beyond exclusively 12th-grade subjects. The detailed structure of CUET 2025 was also explained, covering a total of 37 subjects—comprising 13 languages, 23 domain-specific subjects, and the General Aptitude Test—with the examination offered in 13 Indian languages, a maximum of five papers allowed per candidate, and a syllabus that emphasizes reading comprehension, literary aptitude, vocabulary for languages; the alignment of domain subjects with NCERT curricula; and an assessment of general knowledge, reasoning, numerical ability, and mental ability in the General Aptitude Test, all under a marking scheme of +5 for correct answers and -1 for incorrect ones. Additionally, teachers received information about the tentative schedule for online submissions, the correction window, and the examination period, along with critical details regarding the fee structure, best practices for application form submission, the importance of preparing a list of universities, and the need for proper documentation for PWD candidates, as well as guidance on accessing the official CUET 2025 website and meeting eligibility criteria. In anticipation of common challenges such as overlapping syllabi, limited preparation time, and time management stress, the session also presented strategic measures for student support, including promoting goal setting, integrated and active learning, peer learning, and regular quizzes and "Question of the Day" activities, ultimately empowering teachers with the necessary knowledge and tools to comprehensively support their students through the CUET 2025 journey.
