

Students' Activity 2

Make a seed bomb

A seed bomb, or seed ball, is a ball of seeds mixed with something compostable which can be shaped into a ball. The seeds are encased in the compostable paper or clay and can be thrown into the soil. As the rain falls, the paper composts away, the seeds germinate and grow wherever the bomb is thrown. Rainy season is almost there! Let's plant seed bombs!
